Isaiah 8:12 – "the LORD almighty is the one you are to regard as Holy, he is the one you are to fear, he is the one you are to dread,"

## Babylon's great pride

Dan 4:30, "is this not Babylon the great, which I myself have built as a royal residence by the might of my power and for the glory of my majesty".

Isaiah 13:11 – "I will punish the world for its evil, the wicked for their sins. I will put an end to the arrogance of the haughty and will humble the pride of the ruthless"
