Background

Definitions

Male = someone with an X and a Y chromosome

Female = someone with two X chromosomes

Are both genders equal?

Gen 1:27, "So God created mankind in his own image, in the image of God he created them, male and female he created them."

- The example of Jesus
- Gal 3:28, "there is no male not female for you are all one in Christ Jesus"

God made us equal but God has not made us interchangeable

- 2) External Physical differences
- 3) Internal physical differences
- 4) Roll differences for God's people

Why did God make two different genders?

Reason 1 - So we can make children.

Reason 2 - For companionship

Gen 2:18, "it is not good for man to be alone"

Reason 3 – To help us understand God and point us to heaven

"God has given us two distinctly different genders to enable us to better grasp the nature of God"

"a picture of God's love for us"

So, what do we make of this?

differences ... central to the plans and purposes of God.

Living in light of two equal but different genders
